**NOTICE OF INTERIM PROCEDURE TO ADDRESS FLOODED DOCKS:
LAKE ONTARIO AND THE ST. LAWRENCE RIVER**

ONTARIO REGULATION 148/06: CATARAQUI REGION CONSERVATION AUTHORITY:
REGULATION OF DEVELOPMENT, INTERFERENCE WITH WETLANDS AND ALTERATIONS TO
SHORELINES AND WATERCOURSES

This Interim Procedure is valid between May 26 and August 15, 2017.

The Cataraqui Region Conservation Authority (CRCA) is implementing an Interim Procedure to exempt certain activities from the normal CRCA permit requirements under Ontario Regulation 148/06. The exemption is specific to the installation of *temporary docks* on Lake Ontario and the St. Lawrence River (mainland and islands). Those areas are being affected by ongoing high water levels.

In order to be in compliance with this Interim Procedure, the following requirements must be met:

- The *temporary dock* must be installed on top of the existing footprint (dimensions and location) of an existing dock.
- Persons installing a *temporary dock* must undertake the following two steps:

Step 1 Submit Description Prior to Work Commencing:

Provide a detailed description of the work to the CRCA prior to work commencing (an electronic mail message to info@crca.ca is acceptable) that indicates:

- Landowner name and civic address;
- Condition and dimensions of the existing dock;
- One or more photographs of the existing dock;
- Description and dimensions of the *temporary dock*;

Step 2 Submit Photographs After Installation:

Provide one or more photographs to the CRCA once the *temporary dock* has been installed.

- *Temporary docks* must be removed by August 15, 2017
- If any portion of the *temporary dock* is to be retained as a permanent structure, then a retroactive permit must be obtained from the CRCA prior to August 15, 2017. This will require submission of a CRCA permit application (to info@crca.ca or in-person at the CRCA Administration Office), to attention of Kristen Wozniak, CRCA Development Officer.
- All Federal, Provincial and Municipal requirements for shoreline and in-water works continue to apply.
