

A Message to Dog Owners Visiting Little Cataraqui Creek Conservation Area



Little Cataraqui Creek Conservation Area is visited by people of all ages from school children learning about conservation to seniors enjoying a walk in the woods.

Little Cataraqui Creek is also home to a wide variety of wildlife including deer, coyotes and 22 provincially significant bird species.

Your dog is welcome here provided that it is on a leash and under control at all times. This is for the safety and consideration of our visitors and for the wildlife that lives in the Conservation Area.

Free-running dogs can be intimidating to other visitors and can also chase and disturb wildlife. They can also have unpleasant encounters with other dogs or with wildlife such as skunks and porcupines.

Dog owners are also required to clean up after their pets. Stepping in or skiing through “dog poo” is a very unpleasant experience.

The Cataraqui Region Conservation Authority has regulations in place governing the uses permitted on our properties. Leash laws and other regulations are included in Ontario Regulation 99/90. Copies of this regulation are available at the CRCA Administration Office.
