Obey the signs:

These rules and regulations have been designed to help protect the ecology of Lemoine Point and promote a safe and enjoyable trail experience for all users.

Stay on the trail:

Use of unmarked, or the creation of new trails causes erosion, damages vegetation and can disturb animal habitat.

Do not pick or collect anything:

Removing wildflowers, trees, shrubs or other natural features can disrupt plant and animal survival, as well as alter the beauty of the landscape.

Leash your pets:

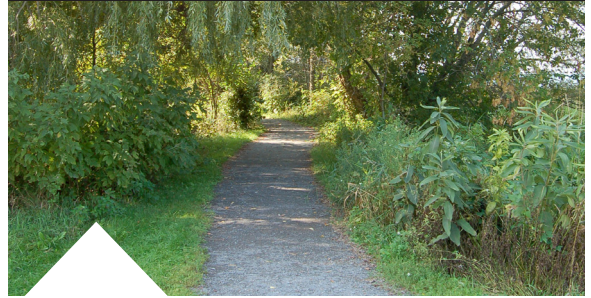
Do not allow your pets to run loose on the trails as it may disturb other hikers or wildlife and damage vegetation that are protected in these areas.

Pack it in, pack it out:

Please do not litter. Take your garbage and recyclables with you when you leave.



Trail Etiquette & Safety



- Stay on the trails to avoid damaging nearby vegetation, shore or creek banks.
- Do not take shortcuts or venture off the marked trails
- Cycle only on designated trails
- Stay to the right on wider paths and pass on the left
- When overtaking someone, let them know you are approaching and will be passing on the left
- Whenever you stop for a view, a rest, or to yield, move to the side of the trail so it is free for others
- When hiking or running in a group, yield to a single or pair. Hike and run single file or take no more than half of a wide trail
- Keep your dog on a leash
- Clean up after your dog
- Do not disturb the wildlife. Avoid using flash photography as it can be harmful to the wildlife, especially the birds and owls.
- "Leave no trace" - leave nothing behind on the trail but footprints, take nothing from the trail but memories
- Take all of your litter home with you, or dispose of it in an appropriate manner
